Attendance

There is a proven link between high attendance and doing well at school. At St Martins we promote the importance of high attendance in our weekly celebration assembly, awarding 'Attendance Bear' to the class with the highest attendance for that week.

As a school we strive for a goal of 100% attendance however we do recognise that there will be times when children are not well enough to be in school. Home Learning

Your child will be set home learning each week - Given out on a **Friday** and collected in by the following Friday. This will consist of a timestable challenge and a spelling task which will be set on Google Classroom and Spelling Shed.

In addition to this, children need to continue daily reading (30 minutes) and we recommend still listening to your child read aloud a few times a week. It is important that the children are heard to read as much as possible to improve their fluency and comprehension, as well as this having a positive impact on their writing. The children will have their reading records for you to sign to say that you have heard them read at home.



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Children will bring home their Accelerated Reader (AR) book each day. These books must come back into school every day as they are also the children's class reading books. Once a child has finished their book will take a short quiz to assess how successfully they have comprehended the text.

Also, it is crucial that children are regularly practicing their times tables on TTRockstars as, next summer, the children will be taking their times tables assessment where they are required to know all their times tables up to 12x12.

Google Classroom

The children will have access to their school Google Account, via Chromebooks and iPads. Through this we will be using Google Classroom, which allows us to share resources and work with the children, but also for us to see their work. The Google Suite can also be accessed at home on most electronic devices. If you need any support with this, then please let us know.

P.E

Both classes have PE on Monday afternoons and Wednesday afternoons.

Monday - PE Kit Tuesday - School Uniform Wednesday - PE Kit Thursday - School Uniform Friday - School Uniform/Forest kit

On PE days, your child needs to come to school dressed in their PE kit.

PE kit should include:

- Black shorts
- T-shirt based on the children's family learning group or plain white t-shirt
- Black tracksuit bottoms
- Trainers
- School jumper to be worn over the top for warmth

Please speak to the office if you are unsure of your child's family learning group.

Forest school

Forest will be the same as last year - alternating between the classes on **Friday afternoons**. Children need to **come to school wearing their forest clothes (long sleeved top and trousers)**. Please make sure that they also come to school with a suitable waterproof coat and wellies in a carrier bag. The children will then need to be collected from the forest at the end of school.

Uniform and Belongings

Please ensure that all personal items are labelled clearly. Even with the best intentions, children do loose things - having them named means that items can find their way back to the correct owner.
