Buckingham Palace has unveiled the full line-up of celebrations to mark the Queen's Platinum Jubilee this year. Street parties, a concert with some of the world's biggest entertainment stars, a chance to see the Queen's homes and a street parade are just some of the formal plans. Many will take place during the upcoming special four-day Bank Holiday weekend from Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> to Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> June. 2022 marks 70 years of the Queen's service – the first British monarch ever to reach the milestone.

#### What is a Royal Jubilee?

A jubilee is a special celebration of a king or queen's reign. They take place after the monarch has ruled for a certain number of years and each one is associated with a different type of precious material. No other British monarch has reigned for long enough to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee, which is why many believe the 2022 celebrations are so special!



Silver = 25 years

Gold = 50 years Diamond = 60 years



Sapphire = 65 years

Platinum = 70 years

#### What events are being organised for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee?

Jubilees have been celebrated since the 1300s! By the 19<sup>th</sup> century, events to mark the Golden Jubilees of George III and Queen Victoria included fetes, feasts, fireworks, and processions.

This year, there are many events and projects to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee including:

- A live concert at Buckingham Palace, which will bring together some of the world's biggest entertainment stars.
- A Big Jubilee Lunch on 5<sup>th</sup> June, with people encouraged to share food and fun with neighbours through street parties, BBQs, or tea parties.
- 200 silk flags will be decorated and paraded along the Mall in London as a 'River of Hope'.
- An initiative, the 'Queen's Green Canopy', encourages people to plant trees in various places, including in school or in their own garden, to mark her 70 years on the throne.
